Step Three

Tradition Three

The relatives of alcoholics, when gathered together for mutual aid, may call themselves an Al-Anon Family Group, provided that, as a group, they have no other affiliation. The only requirement for membership is that there be a problem of alcoholism in a relative or friend.

Concept Three

The right of decision makes effective leadership possible.

Al-Anon is not allied with any sect, denomination, political entity, organization, or institution; does not engage in any controversy; neither endorses nor opposes any cause. There are no dues for membership. Al-Anon is self-supporting through its own voluntary contributions.

Al-Anon has but one purpose: to help families of alcoholics. We do this by practicing the Twelve Steps, by welcoming and giving comfort to families of alcoholics, and by giving understanding and encouragement to the alcoholic.

The Spirit of the Third Tradition

"The relatives of alcoholics when gathered together for mutual aid, may call themselves an Al-Anon Family Group, provided that as a group, they have no other affiliation. The only requirement for membership is that there be a problem of alcoholism in a relative or friend."

The focus of every Al-Anon Family Group is to support recovery from the effects of alcoholism: each of us love someone who abuses or did abuse alcohol.

Focus is difficult for me. I have spent much of my life working out ways to be distracted from what is really going on to chase the dreams of what I want different in my life. When I came to Al-Anon, I faced the one situation I could no longer ignore or handle in the ways I tried before—the effects of my son's abuse of alcohol. I come to Al-Anon for that purpose only and, in listening to other members, have found ways of being and doing things that were new. I tried some suggestions and they worked. My life became more manageable, and I am a happier member of my family!

I found that the group focused on what I could do, not what I couldn't, which helped me develop trust. Trusting the group meant to me that others were there for the same reason I was. I wanted to fully face reality, while changing the thinking, feeling, doing things that were only causing me pain. Each person I spoke to, I trusted because that person had some experience with the feelings I shared, if not the exact circumstances.

Inclusive rather than exclusive, no rules keep me out of belonging to Al-Anon. Only one requirement is expected, that I am affected by someone's alcoholism and need help myself. I just know that when I reach my destination at an Al-Anon meeting I belong there and it brings me hope and relief. Meetings with a focus on that one thing guide me to a grounded path no matter what choices the alcoholic I love is making. I can choose recovery and know where to go to find it.

That is all because of the Third Tradition. My Higher Power uses that to remind me to keep it simple, which I can easily forget. I have no reason to become distracted and can focus on just one thing during the meeting. Since I can do that in the meeting, I find that I can do it in my life outside the meeting. Gradually, I learn how to apply principles I learn in meetings to my daily life because I belong to a fellowship of people who are learning to do the same.

Concept 3

The right of decision makes effective leadership possible.

Growing up, I didn't seem to have many tools to be an effective leader of my own life. I felt scared of putting myself out there in the outside world, because expressing myself usually led to put-downs and criticisms at home. Because of Concept Three, I get the opportunity to learn gently about effective leadership in the safe rooms of Al-Anon, and thus, to have the courage to make good decisions for myself outside the rooms.

Trust is necessary in applying Concept Three. Over the years, I have held many different service positions in Al-Anon that gave me abundant opportunities to develop trust in myself and others. Starting out in each service position, I didn't have much trust in myself and my capabilities. Each time I asked myself, can I really do this job?

Thanks to Concept Three, the answer was yes. Not only could I do it, but I would develop a strong sense of confidence in God, myself and others in the process. Why? Because I was given the trust, dignity and freedom to decide for myself how to perform each role within the prescribed guidelines. Plus, I eventually learned the benefits of delegation and giving others that same trust, dignity and freedom.

Today, I am thankful for Concept Three's right of decision in Al-Anon and how I can use it in my personal life. I am happy to say that I now challenge those old childhood fears by expressing myself and putting myself out there in many ways. Each day, I have the right to decide what I will focus on to be a more effective leader of my life. When my focus is on letting God, my Higher Power, lead the way, I can't go wrong!
